C. TESTING PROGRAMS

Introduction

District group achievement tests are administered in compliance with Kansas State Department of Education regulations and USD 208 Board of Education policies (Policy II). The scores obtained from these tests are used in curriculum planning and to assess the educational needs of individual students.

1. Kansas State Assessment Report

The sophomores were given the Kansas State Assessment in Math and the Kansas State Assessment in Reading and the juniors were given the Kansas Assessment in Science. All tests were taken on the computer. All tests were coordinated through the Guidance Office. The testing disruptions of previous years were far less this year.

2. National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test

The NMSQT was administered to college bound juniors and sophomores in October. College-bound students with at least a B average are strongly encouraged to take this exam. The following results are figured from all the student's scores: The sophomores had a mean total score of 1135 which well exceeded the state mean score of 900. The juniors had a mean total score of 1190 which exceeded the state mean score of 1037.

D. TITLE I PROGRAMS

The Title 1 program provides opportunities for students in grades 1 through 8 to receive additional help in Reading and Math. Because we are a building-wide Title 1 school, Title 1 teachers and paraprofessionals are able to work with all students needing assistance. Some students receive 1-on-1 assistance outside the classroom while others are offered encouragement and assistance during the regular class period., Kindergarten – 5th grade take advantage of our *IXL Program and MyLexia Program* that gives additional opportunities for students everyday by alternating practice in Math and Reading on a personal level. The program identifies their current grade level and measures growth throughout the year.

E. GRANTS**1. Title I Part A: Improving the Academic Achievement of Disadvantaged**

This allocation of \$44,588.00 paid for the costs associated with the special reading and special math programs at the Trego Grade School.

2. Title II Part A: Teacher Quality

The new Title II Part A no longer emphasizes math and science professional development. Based on the results of our needs assessment, we may use the funds for professional development and hiring highly qualified teachers. This allocation of \$18,380.00 paid for PDC, School Improvement with NKESC, and administrative travel.

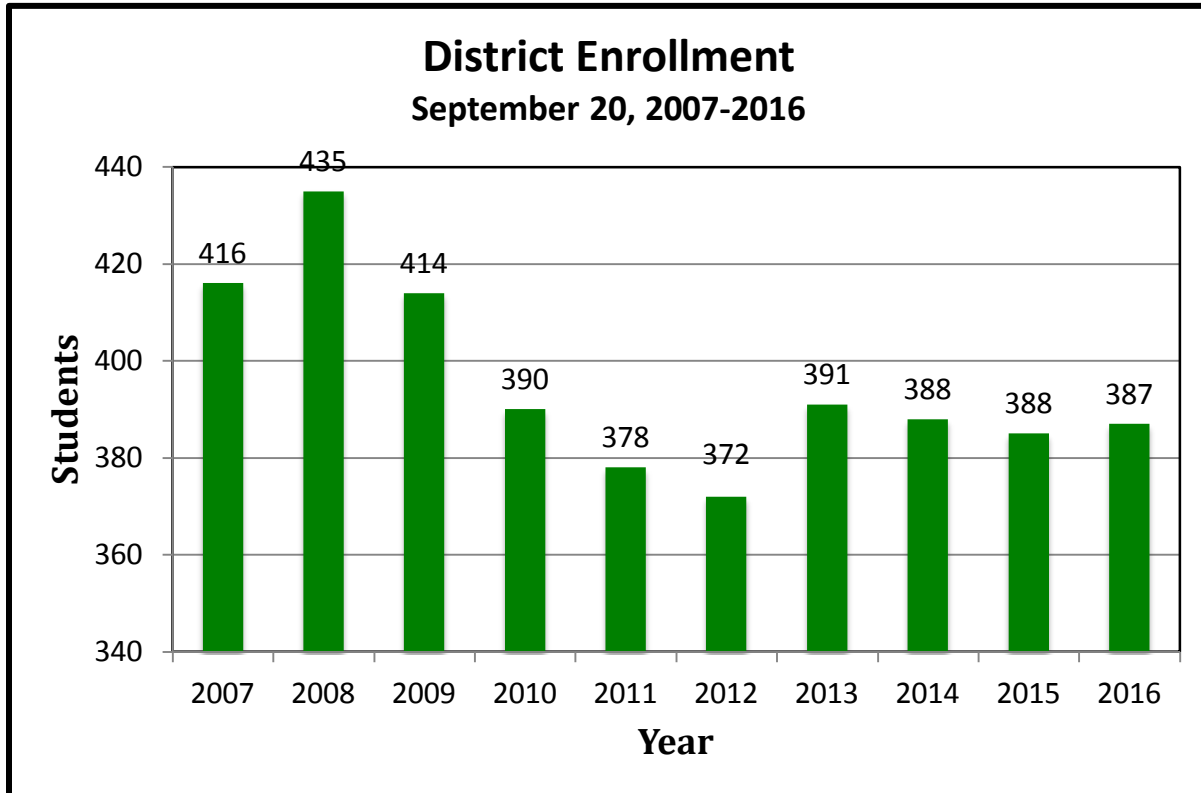

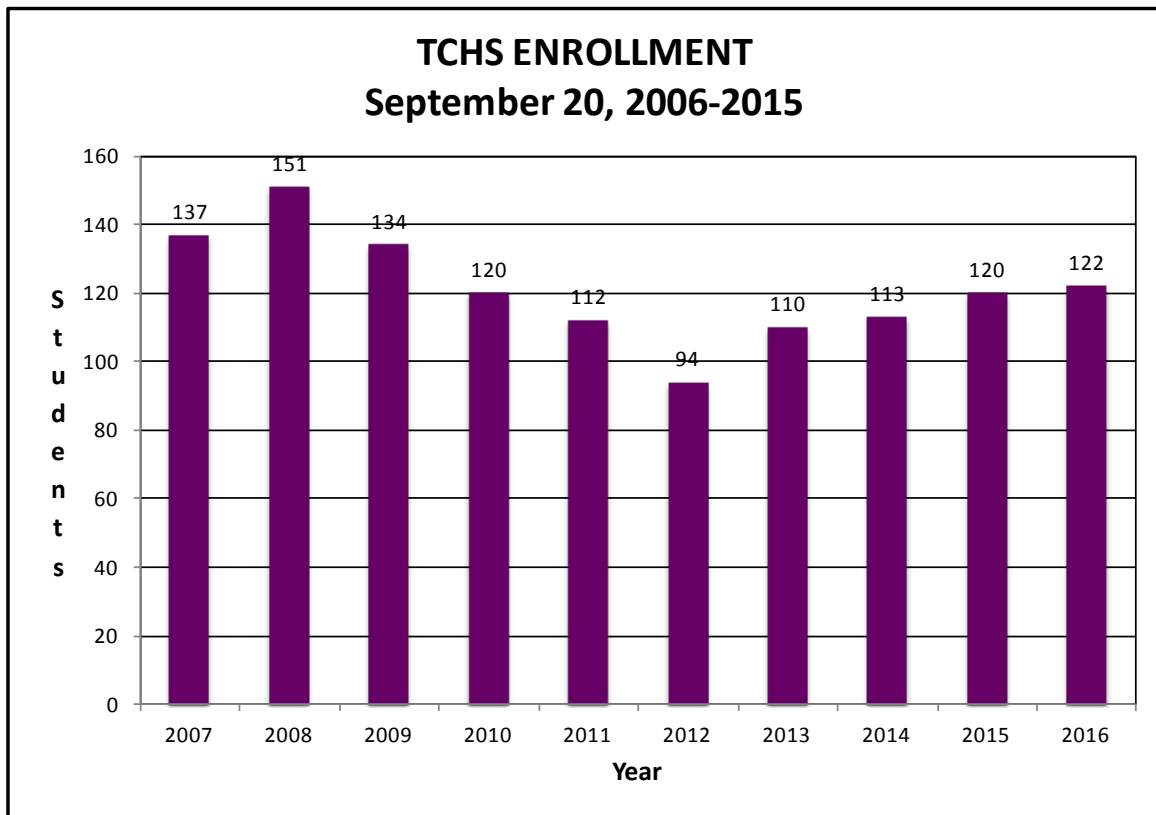
A. DISTRICT ENROLLMENT



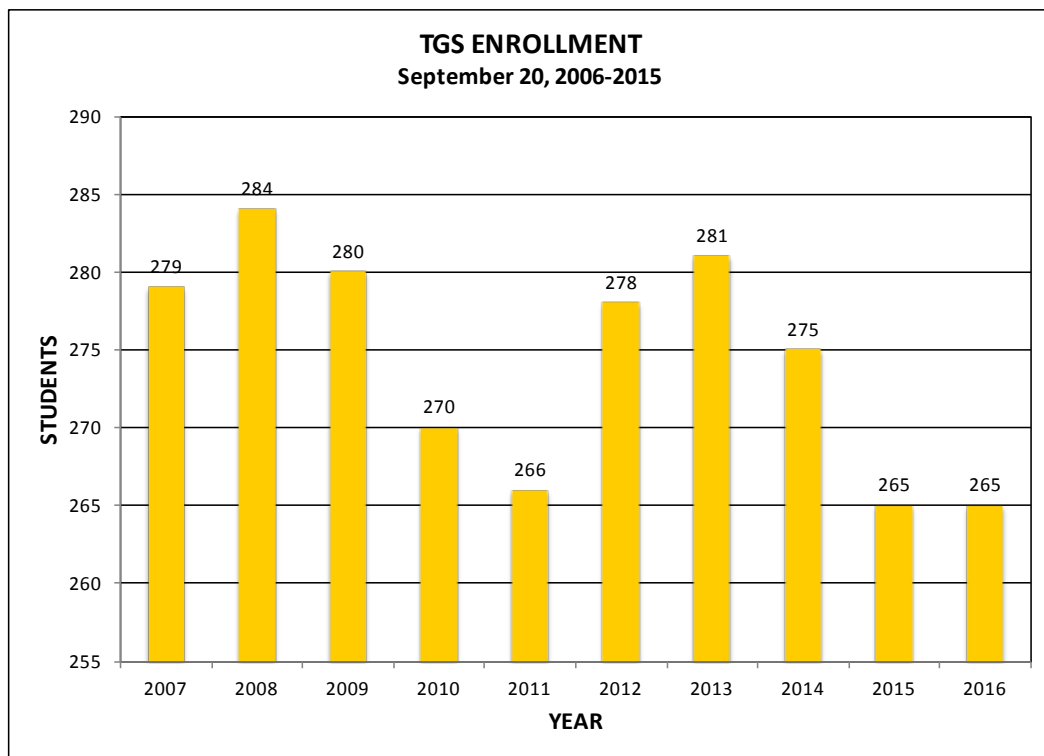

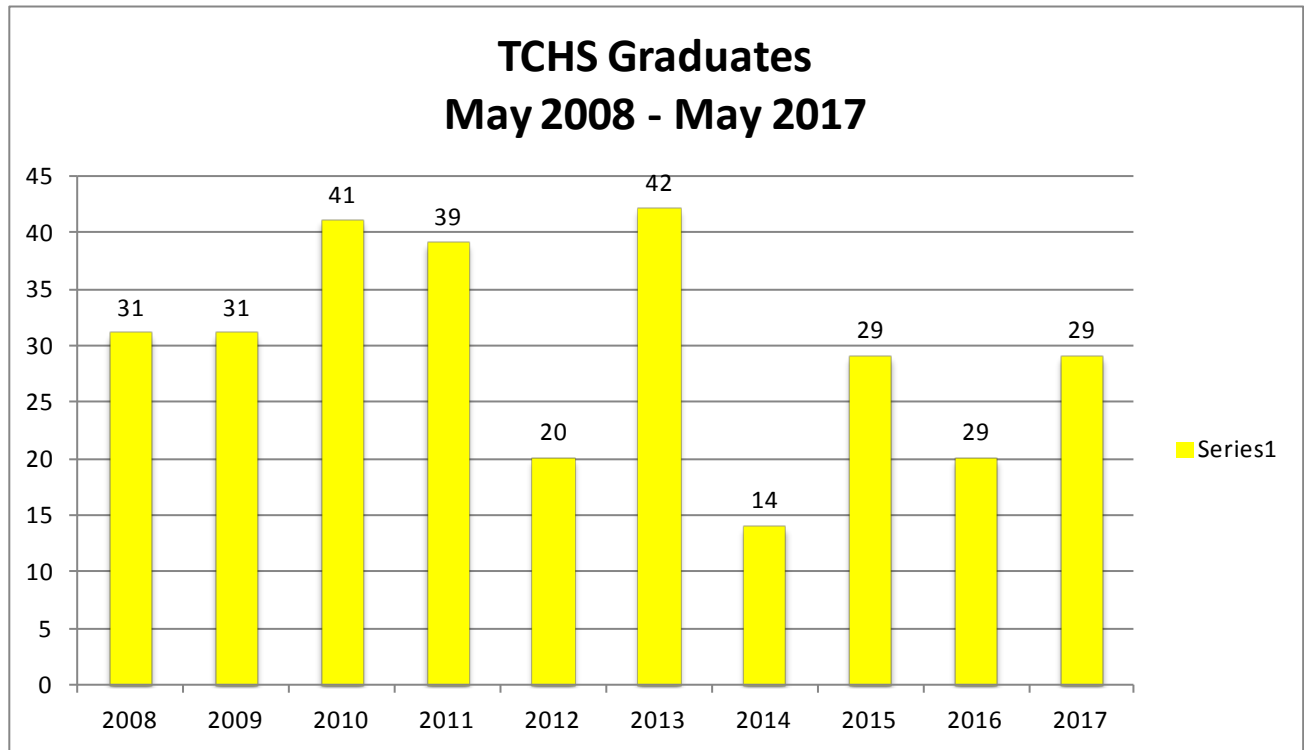
B. TCHS ENROLLMENT

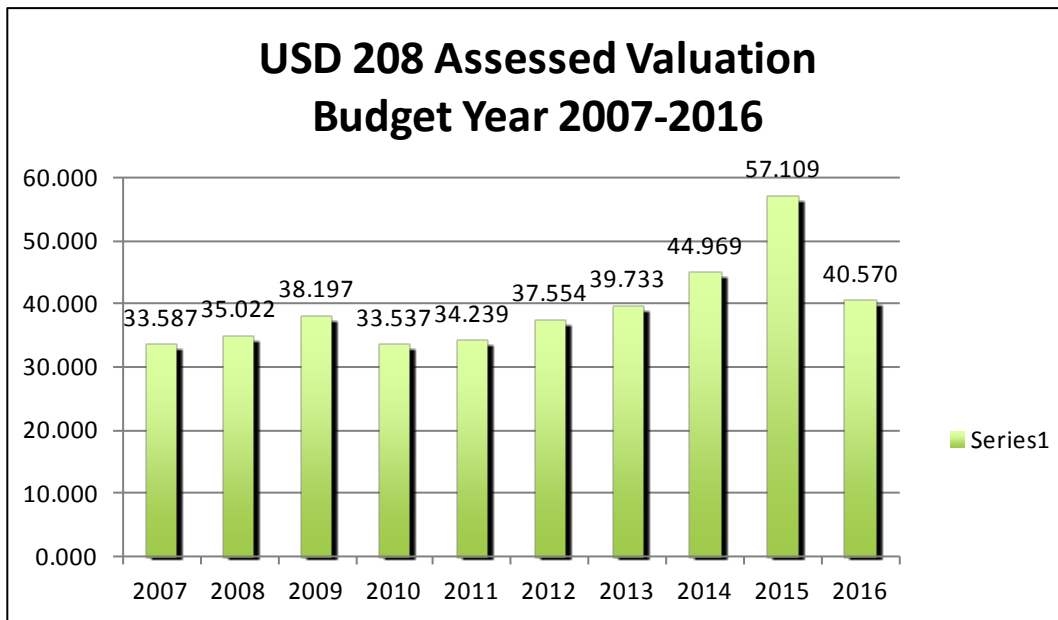

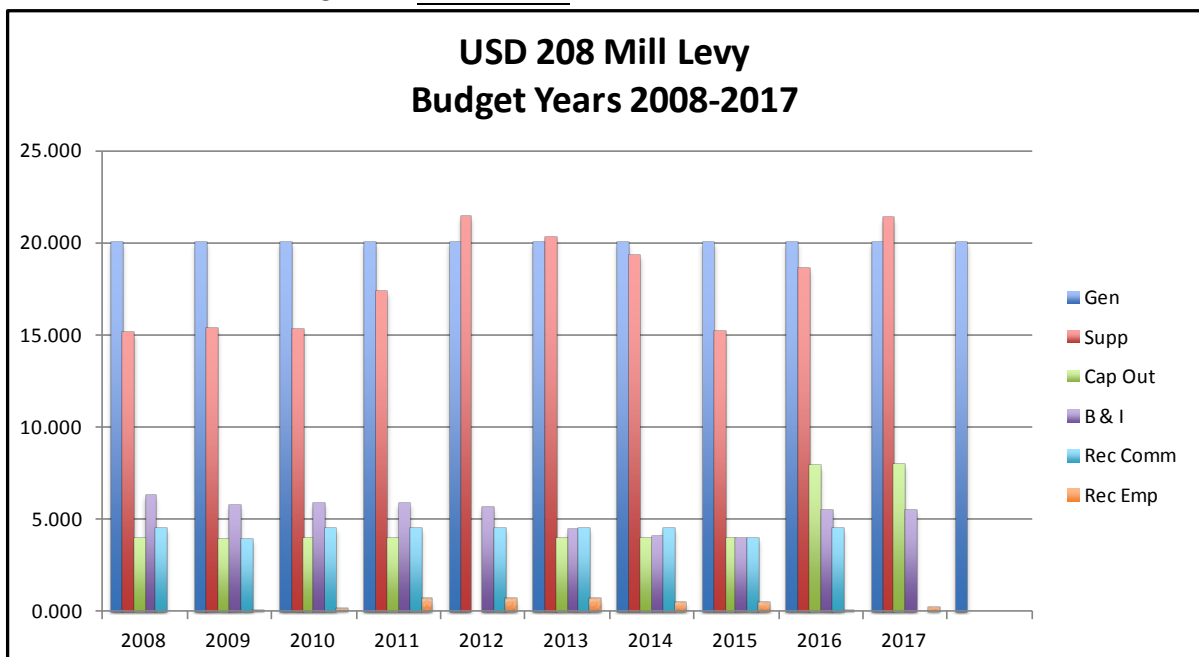

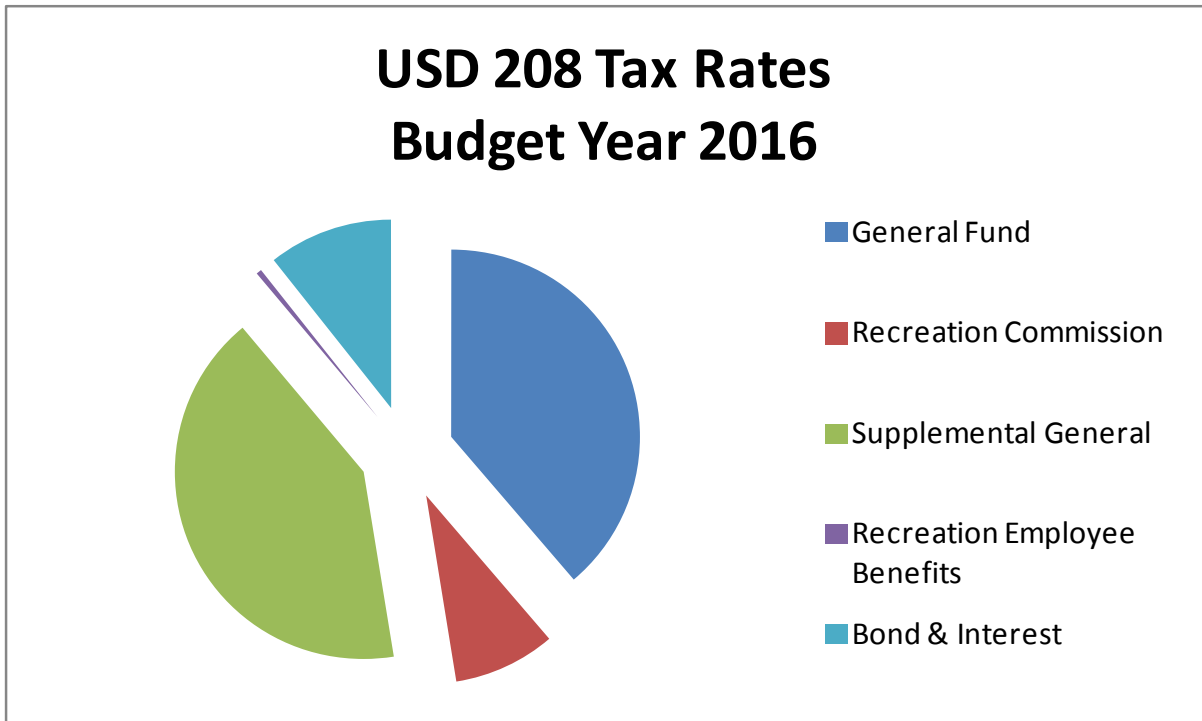

B. GUIDANCE DEPARTMENT

1. Trego Community High School

8th Grade Orientation – The 8th graders visited the high school building and met with several teachers and the counselor to get an idea of how to start their high school program. A freshman orientation meeting was held for both students and parents to ask questions. Both meetings included several coaches and sponsors presenting information about individual programs.

Pre-Enrollment – Pre-enrollment was conducted for all TCHS students including next year's freshmen. The 8th graders visited the high school building and met with several teachers and the counselor to get an idea of how to start their high school program. A freshman orientation meeting was held for both students and parents to ask questions. An informational night was held for in-coming freshmen and their parents, and the students were invited to the high school during the school day to visit with teachers and tour the school. Explanation of graduation requirements, course descriptions, and pre-requisites, college-prep planning, NCAA requirements, Qualified Admissions, etc. were discussed with all students. Both meetings included several coaches and sponsors presenting information about individual programs. Pre-enrollment forms were collected and summarized to estimate class needs for the 2017-18 school year. This year we attempted to enroll students via the Career Cruising program. As the staff learn more about that process, the more smoothly it will go. We are currently working on building a master schedule and an individual schedule for each student.

School/Community Climate Activities – Special School/Community Climate activities conducted through the Guidance Office were Community Appreciation Day and Senior to Senior Day, both designed to help students be involved in the community and to give back to the community for all the support throughout the year. We got very favorable feedback about both of these programs and are encouraged to do both programs each year. I must give credit where credit is due. These programs would not run as smoothly each year if I did not have an incredible staff with which to work. They get to see kids in a different light and vice/versa.

Another new program that we implemented this year is “A Friend Asks”. This is a program that provides very direct suggestions for what an individual can do if a friend or if they themselves are having suicidal thoughts. Very often if an adolescent is considering suicide, a peer and/or friend is the first to know of these thoughts. The phone app, “A Friend Asks” is readily available with steps of how to help someone. Each high school student attended the a brief informational session about this program.

Career Cruising – This was the first year that USD 208 implemented the individual student learning plan Career Cruising. Career Cruising is an all-inclusive web-based program that combines comprehensive career information with the personal perspective of individual students through the use of interest inventories. The areas that we specifically presented this year were interest inventories, learning style inventories, and college/career goals. Each high school student completed the inventories, college search, and the seniors completed the financial aid portion.

Sophomore testing – The sophomores were given the Kansas State Assessment in Math and the Kansas State Assessment in Reading and the Juniors were given the Kansas Assessment in Science. All tests were taken on computer. All tests were coordinated through the Guidance Office. The testing disruptions of previous years were far less this year.

National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test - National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test - The NMSQT was administered to college bound juniors and sophomores in October. College-bound students with at least a B average are strongly encouraged to take this exam. The following results are figured from all the student's scores: The sophomores had a mean total score of 1135 which well exceeded the state mean score of 900. The juniors had a mean total score of 1190 which exceeded the state mean score of 1037.

Junior Information – We conducted an informational session for parents of juniors, soon to be seniors. The information was focused on all of the options and decisions facing seniors. This meeting followed the 8th grade parent meeting.

Senior Information – Seniors were given information concerning special dates, scholarships, application deadlines, college representative visits, and other senior concerns via Senior English classes and posted bulletins, on the Trego Eagles web site, and via email to senior school emails.

Financial Aid – In order to get high school seniors more aware and involved in understanding the financial aid process, I presented information to all seniors via the Senior English classes. The financial aid process is well presented on Career Cruising. I provided each senior with an outline of the process and asked them to take notes on the outline which could be shared with parents. I picked up the notes and mailed the outline and the student notes to each parent/guardian with a letter encouraging them to discuss with their son or daughter. Since the FAFSA has been online as the preferred method, this process seemed to work well.

Awards Night – Awards Night was held on May 10th. Departmental achievement awards and academic achievement awards were presented. Scholarships and special senior awards were also awarded at this time.

Transcripts – Transcripts were finalized and copies sent to various universities, colleges, and vo-tech schools, etc. as requested by senior students and/or parents.

Transition - Since announcing my retirement and the hiring of a new counselor, I have worked with Joleen Schoenthaler a few times to help the transition be as smooth as possible and so that students will continue to have access to college/career and social emotional information and/or support.

8th Grade Orientation-Accompany 8th graders on their orientation tour of TCHS and assisted TCHS guidance counselor in having 8th graders complete pre enrollment schedules for the upcoming 9th grade year. Assist TCHS counselor in Career Cruising online enrollment follow up activity at TJH for 8th graders.

8th Grade Transition Meetings- Meet with Jr. High resource room teacher, high school resource room teacher, High school counselor, 8th grade students on IEPs and their parents to discuss and plan for transition into high school.

Career Exploration for 6th Grade-Coordinate with NWKTC in Goodland to have 6th graders attend Sixth Grade Career Day. Complete local arrangements and accompany group on field trip.

Counseling Sessions/Individual Student Support-Provide support to individual students on both an as need and ongoing basis. The support sessions target a variety of needs such as: academic, social skills/ peer relationships, managing emotions/self regulation, and family concerns.

Schoolwide Character Development Activities- Help plan, organize and implement school-wide activities that put character skills into action. This has included activities such as the school-wide clean up day. An activity that continues to be in progress based on the school-wide clean up day is the development of an outdoor classroom area at TGS. This is being done in conjunction with the STEM teacher.

Character Education Lessons-Conduct weekly classroom lessons in grades kindergarten through second grade. Conduct lessons as requested for additional grade levels.

AIMSweb Assessment- Coordinate AIMSweb testing for kindergarten, first and second graders. Responsibilities include: entering student data and appropriate demographic markers into the web based system, establishing class groupings and teacher access, downloading and distributing benchmark probes (Fall, Winter, Spring). Assisting teachers with data entry issues, interpretation of results, and understanding of test administration guidelines and norms. Assist with the progress monitor process for at-risk students. Download, print and archive the classroom benchmark results for Fall, Winter and Spring.

MAP Testing Kdg-8th Grade-Download and print individual student results to be filed in cumulative files and sent to parents. Download and print grade level/classroom results to be distributed to teachers for use in student monitoring and curriculum planning. Download various reports available through the MAP system to review outcomes and use information for class level, grade level, subject area, and student level interpretation.

TJH Career Cruising- Introduce 6th, 7th and 8th grade students to the Career Cruising program by completing the Matchmaker Inventory, Learning Styles Inventory and completing career exploration activities.

Student Improvement Team-Chair the TGS/TJH (kdg-8th) Student Improvement Team (SIT). This involves taking teacher and parent referrals, contacting/interviewing parents, scheduling team meetings, chairing meetings and assisting in brainstorming interventions. The SIT team meet on an as need basis, with multi meetings some weeks and no meetings on other weeks. The purpose of the SIT meeting is to assist classroom teachers in targeting areas of need and developing interventions for students' areas of need. This process is a federally mandated step referred to as general education intervention (GEI).

Additional Committee/Team Involvement-Team member for special education meetings including: referrals, evaluation meetings, and annual updates. 504 team member; assist in gathering data from records, teacher, parents and specialists in order to determine 504 eligibility and to assist in developing 504 plans.

Individual Development Training-Complete NKESC MIS training and any additional trainings deemed appropriate, attend local/district in-services.

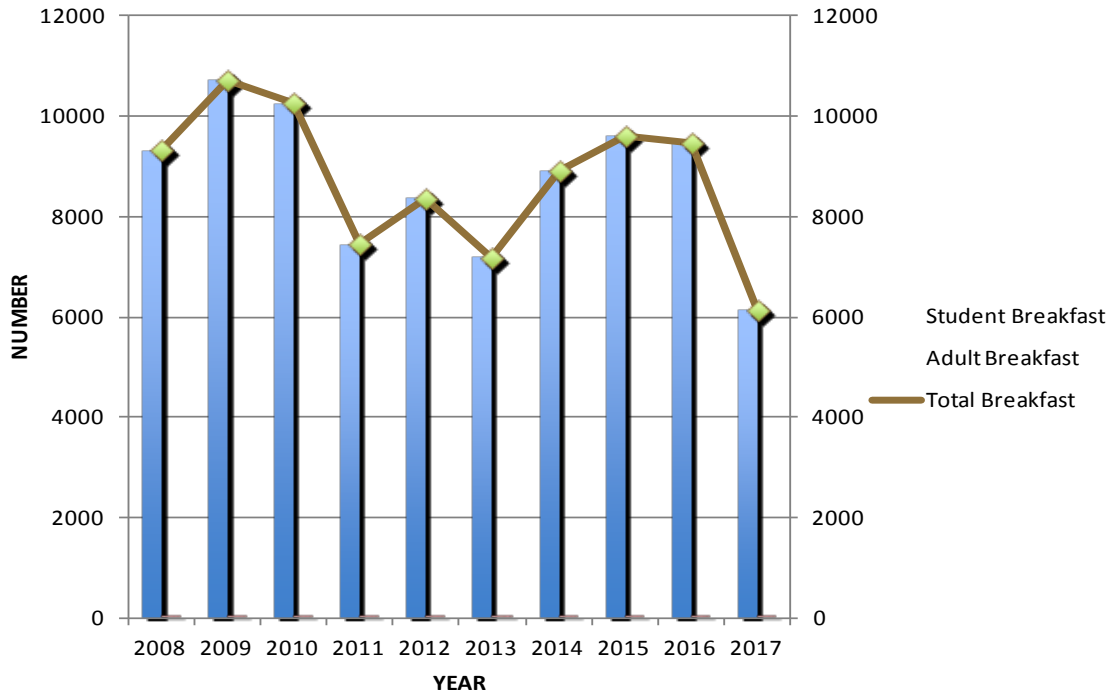

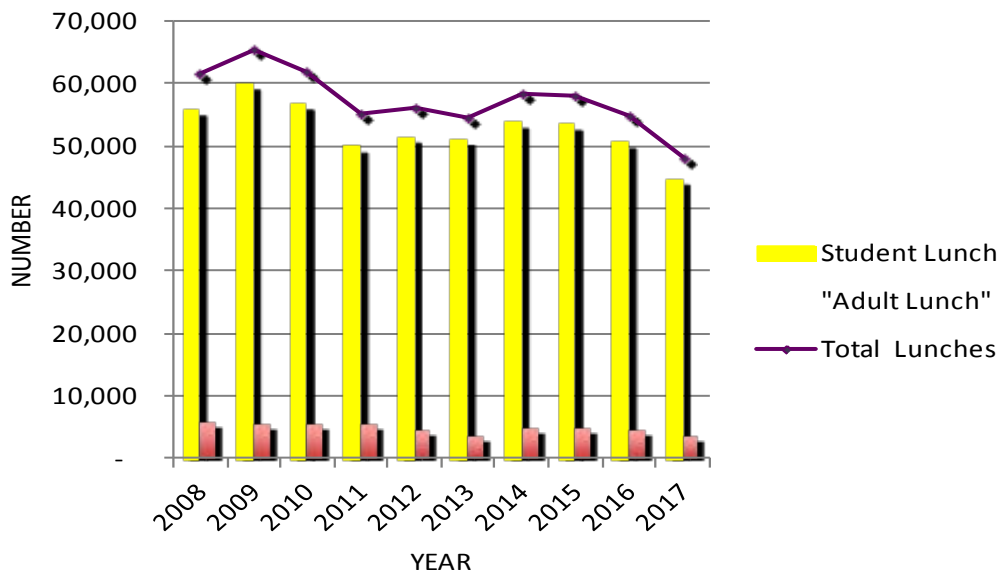

YEAR ENDING 2008 THROUGH 2017**



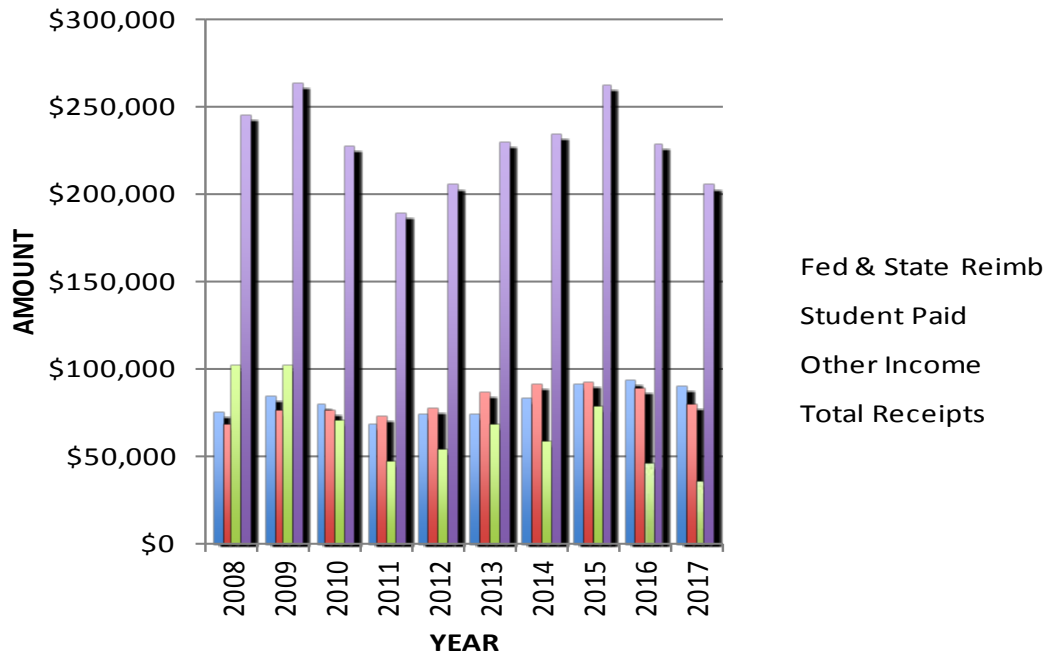
D. LUNCH MEALS SERVED

E. FOOD SERVICE INCOME

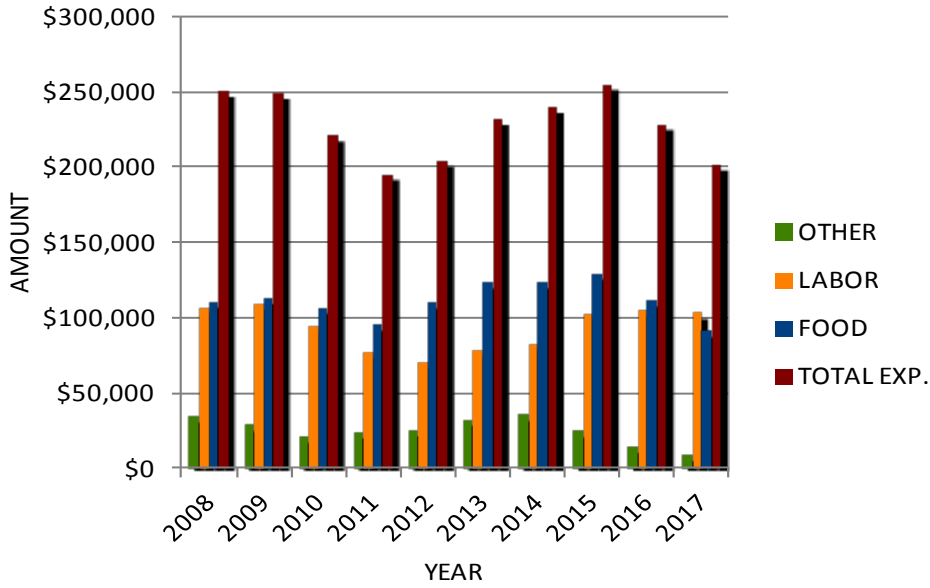
**USD 208 INCOME

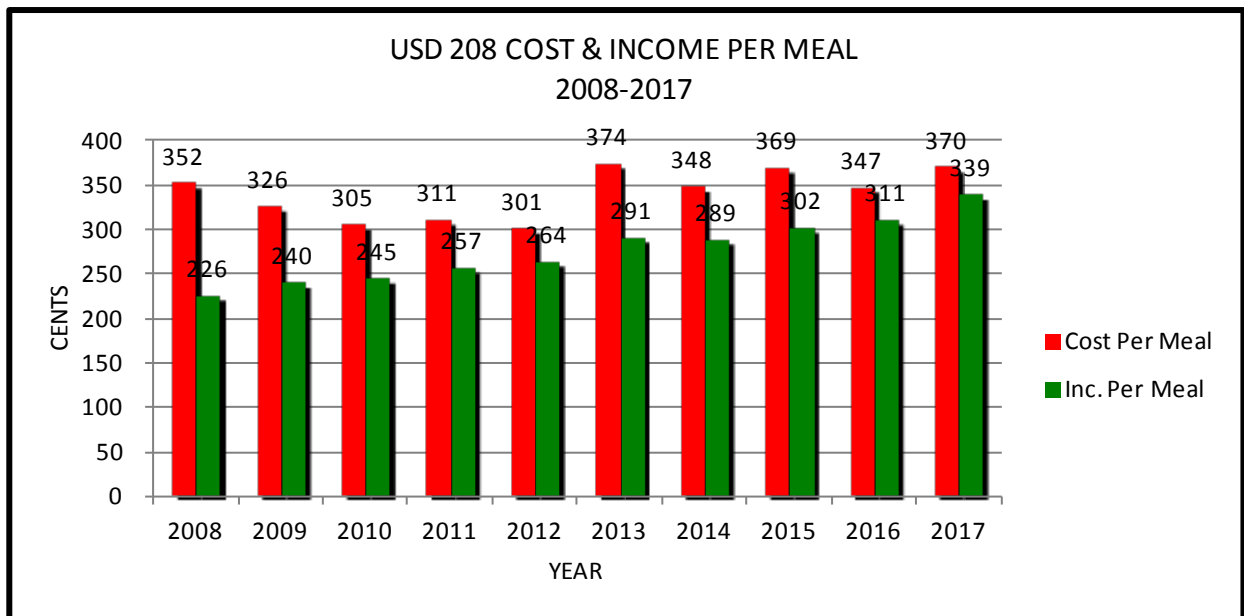

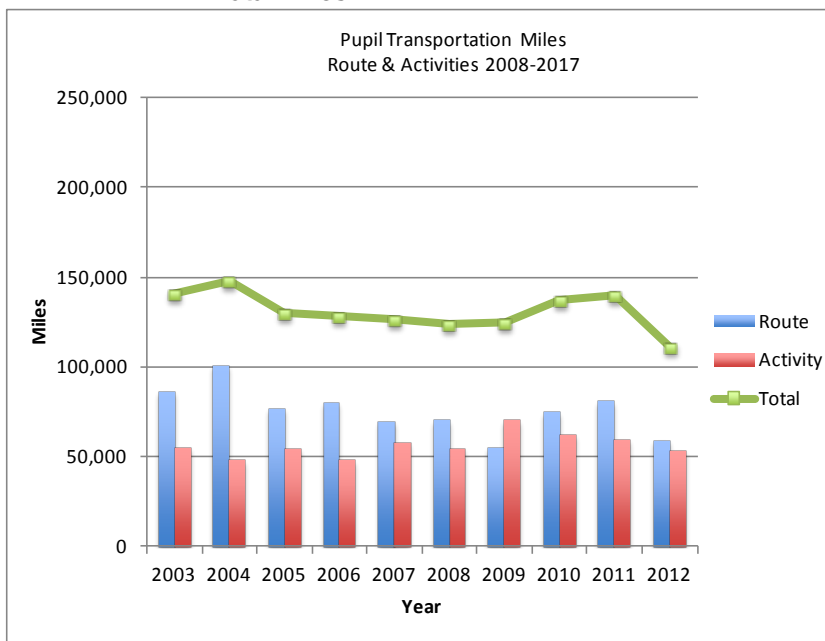
